As participants and organizers gathered before the opening, they went around the room and shared their feelings. Marsh Staubing, a member of Mil-Tree, had created a work of art for the first "Art of War" and had found it to be a moving experience.

Staubing said she was particularly excited about the new group of people who have come together. "There will never be a group like this again," she said.

Each writing was mounted and hung on the wall near the corresponding work of art. The art, ranging from Melissa Spurr's electric light sculpture, to Kelly Witmer's painting on canvas, to Steve Reiman's free-standing metal sculpture, expressed a depth of feeling and connection that those attend-

ing the event echoed.

Sue Cram, owner and operator of Joshua Tree Uprising Adventure, said she had come to support her friend Kay Mead. Mead's moving piece about the death of her husband at a young age from post-traumatic stress disorder was a healing process for her family. As Meade read, her children and grandchild listened from the front row.
